Welcome

No other part of the world is so richly embellished in history, culture, and spectacular scenery as in Europe. Your cruise vacation will take you to some of the most exciting ports in Europe. The days ashore present an invitation to adventure, education, and enjoyment. Organized Shore Excursions give you the opportunity to explore the many fascinating places you will want to see. To ensure the best possible sightseeing, Azamara Cruises has planned a varied program of excursions ranging from simple to sophisticated, in tune with existing conditions in each port. These excursions are arranged and operated by independent agencies, with experienced guides to escort you. This brochure lists the descriptions of the available Shore Excursions at each port of call. Most Shore Excursions may be purchased in advance. Certain excursions are limited in the total number of participants; therefore, for your convenience, we recommend you advance purchase. Also, please note that all tour duration times are approximate and can change without prior notice.

General Information

When should I reserve my Shore Excursions?

This brochure contains brief descriptions of tours available. Please book your excursions as soon as possible since some shore excursions can accommodate only a limited number of participants. Tours are sold on a first-come, first serve basis and we recommend that you purchase them in advance of your cruise in order to avoid disappointment. An order form is included with this brochure. Azamara Cruises must receive the order form and payment at least 20 days before sailing. You will be notified if a tour of your choice is not available. On board, you may purchase tours through the interactive TV system in your stateroom (if available), by booking form dropped at the excursion desk or directly at the Shore Excursion Office during the hours advertised in the ships daily program.

How can I book shore excursions in advance via the Internet?

You can purchase your shore excursions online by visiting our website, www.azamaracruises.com at any time. To pre-book an excursion, you will need your cruise reservation number (obtained from your travel agent or reservation agent), ship name, and sailing date. Once you have completed your purchase, an immediate recap of the selected tours will be provided along with a final e-mail confirmation when your credit card purchase is approved. Your purchased tour ticket(s) will be delivered to you in your stateroom. Kindly note that you have up to 4 days prior to your sail date to purchase your shore excursions online. Once within the 4-day sail date deadline, the booking system is closed and tours are no longer available for pre-booking. From this point, all guests must book their excursions on board the vessel on a first-come, first-serve basis. Your stateroom attendant will deliver your purchased ticket(s) to your stateroom on the evening of embarkation. If you do not receive your tickets in your stateroom, please inquire at the Shore Excursion Office as soon as possible.

What is a Tender Port of Call?

There are some ports where the ship remains at anchor. Either the ship's boats (tenders) or local boats will be used to transport you back and forth between the ship and shore. Tender ports are indicated on the itinerary pages.

What do Shore Excursions include?

Shore Excursions include transportation according to the itinerary, meals, refreshments, guides, and entrance fees as indicated. Fares for Shore Excursions are subject to change without notice. All prices quoted are based on tariffs and exchange rates current at the time of printing, and are subject to increase with or without previous notice consequent upon any increase in the basic tariff and/or exchange fluctuations, which may accrue prior to commencement of the tours.

Prices of shore excursions are quoted per person and generally include available local transportation, ranging from coaches, taxis, limousines, and boats. Meals and local taxes are included where specified. Where tours are operated by car, 2 to 3 persons are allocated to each vehicle. Prices do not include any expenses incurred in returning to the ship should it be elected to leave the group before the tour is completed.

When and where do Shore Excursions depart?

Most tours will meet in a lounge on board the ship prior to departing. When the ship is at anchor, staff will be on hand to assist you to the departure point.

Timings have been established according to information received from the local Agents but are subject to alterations should the vessels arrival time at the port be delayed or circumstances arise whereby the itinerary for a particular excursion must, necessarily, be amended. Guests should be mindful of the fact that at ports where the ship lies at anchor, the afternoon excursions commence from the dockside, not the ship. Guests should, therefore, allow at least 30 minutes for the tender ride to shore.

When booking more than one tour in a day, please allow at least 60 minutes between the return of the first tour and the departure of the second tour.

Tour departure times may vary from those listed on the order form, especially in ports where the ship must tender guests ashore. Please



check your tour tickets for the time and location of departure. No announcements for the tours will be made on board the ship.

Is it possible to miss the Ship?

All guests are required to be back aboard ship no later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled departure time, which is listed in the Daily Program and posted at the gangway. The scheduling of all Shore Excursions conforms to this requirement. If you leave a tour en route; however, it will be your responsibility to secure transportation and return to the pier on time. If for any reason a ship's excursion is delayed, the ship will be notified and await the tours return.

What type of transportation is used for Shore Excursions?

Standards of transport vary considerably; however, Shore Excursions utilize the best quality transportation possible in each port. Air-conditioned vehicles are not always available nor do all tour buses have restroom facilities on board. Please note that some countries have local restrictions and/or zoning laws that prohibit the use of the on board facilities and prohibit the idling of engines while parked at the various venues. The air-conditioning systems may not be to North American standards. Please also bear in mind that cars, taxis or mini-buses may be used in some ports where coaches are not available or are limited.

What if I wish to take the same coach as my family or friends?

Guests wishing to travel with friends should proceed to the point of departure as indicated on your shore excursion tickets, as this will help the tour staff to allocate space in the same vehicle.

What if I wish to tour on my own?

Guests who do not join these prearranged shore excursions must, therefore, rely on whatever transportation equipment might be available, and they are advised that the drivers are not under supervision. Such drivers may not be informed of the sailing hour of the ship and it is not certain that they will follow routes that are more desirable. In addition, considering the limited transportation facilities in some ports, relief cars may not be obtainable in case of breakdowns along the road. Tours are the best way of seeing the country during a stay at a cruise port of call and they have been arranged so the guests see as much of interest as possible.

Refunds for independent tour arrangements will not be provided in the event of cancelled/missed ports.

Will transportation be available from the ship to city centers?

Many ports are not located in the city center. For the convenience of guests, a shuttle bus service has been arranged (for a nominal fee) in those ports (where applicable) that are located approximately 1 mile or more away from the closest city center and do not have adequate local transportation available. This service is set up to complement local transportation, and guests are welcome to utilize local services, when and where available. Details of which ports will have a shuttle service will be advised on board the ship.

How should I tip our Guide/Driver?

Extending a gratuity to your guide or driver is strictly optional; however, in some countries, these personnel may anticipate that if you are pleased with their services, you will reward them in a monetary way. A commonly accepted guideline is USD \$3.00 per person for a half-day tour and USD \$5.00 per person for a full-day tour.

Will I miss meals when I go ashore?

Most tour departure times complement the ship's meal service hours, so you can enjoy your meal aboard and then go ashore. However, if you take more than one tour in a day, your return on board may not coincide with meal hours. You will be informed of meal times before arrival in each port. Full day tours include meals where indicated.

What should I wear?

Some countries may have more conservative ideas about dress than you are accustomed. So as not to offend local opinion, it is suggested that you dress conservatively. When visiting places of worship (temples, mosques, etc.), you should avoid wearing shorts, tank tops, or revealing clothing. Guests should wear comfortable walking shoes at all times. When visiting ruins or walking on cobblestone streets, wear rubber-soled shoes. It is also smart to wear a sun hat, protective sunscreen, and sunglasses.

Will I have time to shop?

Whenever possible, shopping time has been allocated within the framework of the excursions. However, tours are not designed for shopping and time is limited.

How do I pay for Shore Excursions on board?

The only way to pay for Shore Excursions on board is through your shipboard credit system for which you sign up after boarding the ship.



*Children's tickets are available on some tours for guests aged 4 years to 12 years (inclusive). Guests aged 13 and over will be charged the adult price. A parent or guardian must accompany guests under 18 years of age. Infants 3 years and under will be carried free of charge, subject to them not occupying a seat.

Prices included herein are subject to change at any time. We suggest booking your excursions at www.azamaracruises.com for current prices.

How strenuous are the Shore Excursions in each port of call?

Most of the cities you will be visiting during your cruise vacation were built without regard for the modern conveniences and freedoms we may take for granted today. They offer quaint, narrow, cobblestone streets, and large bustling walkways that have been in existence long before the advent of motorized transportation. To preserve their antiquity, many cities and old towns are pedestrian-only, and may not be conveniently accessible for guests with mobility impairments. All of the Shore Excursions require some degree of mild, moderate, or strenuous walking. Likewise, venues that have grand entryways, multiple stories, and sprawling gardens, make stair-climbing a necessity. To assist our guests, we have rated each Shore Excursion within this brochure by the amount of walking and stair climbing needed to fully participate in the excursion as indicated by the tour description.

The Shore Excursions presented in this brochure require the guests to use a coach or other forms of transfer which will require you to step up 2 to 3 steps, approximately 10 inches high each. Most (but not all) coaches used can accommodate collapsible wheelchairs to be stored in the luggage compartment underneath the coach. However, it should be noted that escorts, drivers, guides, and shipboard staff are not obliged to lift guests into the vehicles. Lift-vans and/or coaches are not available in all ports of call. Tendering may preclude guests in wheelchairs from going ashore at certain ports of call. For further information, please check with the Shore Excursion Office on board immediately upon arrival.

Due to the various celebrations taking place during the year 2009, kindly note that certain circumstances may arise where the tour content or itinerary may have to be altered without prior notice. This is beyond the control of either the local tour operator or Azamara Cruises Inc. Please note there are certain excursions that for safety reasons, age, weight, and/or height restrictions apply. The individual vendors impose these restrictions and Azamara Cruises must comply accordingly.

Guests wishing activity type tours (i.e. biking, kayaking, hiking, etc.) should be in excellent health and make themselves aware of the physical, age, and fitness requirements before making a value judgment as to whether or not to participate. Any guest with limitations, who are pregnant, who have had recent surgery, or are taking prescription drugs, should check with the excursion office before booking any activity type tours.

By booking the excursion, you are also confirming that you and your party are in good physical and mental condition and have no history of seizures, dizziness, fainting, heart conditions or respiratory problems. You also confirm that no one is taking medicine that carries a warning about impairment of physical or mental abilities.

For the comfort of all our guests, smoking is not permitted aboard any sightseeing vehicle or transport.

Kindly note the below symbols act only as a guideline and guests must make their own judgment regarding participating in tours.

Mild



To fully participate may require leisurely walking over primarily even surfaces. There may be a limited number of steps, a minimal amount of cobblestones or uneven surfaces, and some standing for extended periods of time.

Moderate



To fully participate may require extended periods of walking over even and uneven surfaces, steep terrain and/or water activity in a slight current. There may be steps, inclines, cobblestone surfaces, and extended periods of standing. Participants with physical limitations should take this into account.

Strenuous



To fully participate may require extended periods of physical exertion, extensive walking, climbing, or biking. There may be numerous steps, inclines, cobblestones, and other rough terrain throughout the excursion. These excursions are the most active and have been designed for participants in excellent health and very good physical condition.

Meals



Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. If a meal is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.

Dress Code





Conservative attire is recommended when going ashore on this tour. No exposed shoulders or knees. Short pants and tank tops are not acceptable.

Shopping



Time permitting, limited shopping is available during the tour.

Waiver



All participants on this tour are required to complete a waiver and/or release form. This document will be distributed by the tour operator prior to commencing the tour.

Light Snack / Refreshment



If a light snack or refreshment is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.



Terms and Conditions

1. The Guest accepts that Celebrity Cruises Inc., d/b/a Azamara Cruises (hereinafter referred to as "Azamara") in selling tickets, coupons or vouchers or making arrangements for shore excursions, acts as agent only for others who operate such services and has no responsibility for the performance of the Shore Excursions herein specified.
2. Azamara undertakes to use its best endeavor to ensure that a Shore Excursion is performed as advertised. However, the Passenger accepts that in certain circumstances and for reasons beyond the control of Azamara of whatsoever kind or nature it may be impractical, unwise, or impossible for the Shore Excursion to be performed. The decision to abandon or withdraw any Shore Excursion is to be taken at the sole discretion of Azamara but always taking into account the safety and convenience of the passenger. Azamara shall in no event be liable to the passenger in respect of occurrences prior to embarkation and after disembarkation from the vessel.
3. Shore excursions are subject to cancellation or modification, depending on the number of guests participating. In the event of a tour cancellation or modification, advance notice will be given by shipboard personnel. Certain tours have a minimum booking requirement, or must be limited to a maximum number of participants.
4. The itineraries are expected by Azamara to be as advertised, but Azamara reserves the right to change such itineraries or to omit any place or places or to alter the advertised sequence of the excursion in accordance with the conditions and circumstances prevailing at the time of the excursion with or without previous notice. Any such change, omission, or alteration made by Azamara shall be made at their sole discretion but always bearing in mind the safety, convenience and/or best interests of the passenger.
5. Passengers are advised to leave their baggage and all items of value on board the vessel. Azamara accepts no responsibility for any loss of, or damage to, any such baggage, or item of value occurring during or relative to the Shore Excursion(s) specified on the face hereof.
6. Azamara is committed to local operators in respect of reservations made. Azamara hereof must therefore receive notice of any cancellation before the closing date and hour of the Shore Excursion(s) published, failing which a refund can only be made in the event of the ticket being resold. In the event, however, of the Shore Excursion(s) having to be canceled in accordance with Clause 2 hereof or for any other reason, Azamara will refund in full the monies paid and upon tendering such refund to passengers, Azamara shall be free of all liability in respect thereof.
7. THE SHORE EXCURSIONS, TRANSFERS AND SHORE TOUR PACKAGES ARE OPERATED BY INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS. NEITHER CELEBRITY CRUISES INC. NOR ANY OF ITS SUBSIDIARIES, AFFILIATES, PARENT OR THEIR RESPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, DIRECTORS, AGENTS OR CONTRACTORS (COLLECTIVELY THE "AZAMARA ENTITIES") SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE IN ANY WAY FOR ANY DAMAGE, LOSS, INJURY OR DEATH ARISING OUT OF ANY SERVICES PROVIDED BY SUCH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS. THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE AZAMARA ENTITIES DOES NOT EXTEND BEYOND THE VESSEL AND ALL ARRANGEMENTS MADE FOR OR BY THE PASSENGER FOR SHORE SIDE EXCURSIONS, TRANSPORTATION OR ACTIVITIES ARE AT THE PASSENGERS RISK.

Personal Possessions

Personal articles such as coats, cameras, handbags, etc., are the guest's responsibility. Do not leave your possessions unattended at any time.

Responsibility

Shore Excursions are operated by reputable local agencies and have been thoroughly checked by Azamara Cruises for full interest and value. Shore Excursions are offered for sale by Azamara Cruises as a convenience to our guests. While great care has been taken to offer the finest excursions available in each port, these tour services are provided by independent tour operators and Azamara Cruises will not be responsible or liable for any loss, damage, injury, costs or delays resulting from, or in connection with, your use of these services. Azamara Cruises acts only as the agent of the supplier of these services and does so on the express condition that no liability of any kind, howsoever caused, shall attach to Azamara Cruises or its agents, servants or employees in connection with or arising there from.

All tickets, coupons, and vouchers issued by Azamara Cruises for Shore Excursion arrangements made on behalf of guests are expressly subject to the terms and conditions of the person or company providing such transportation facilities ashore.

Refunds of Prepaid Excursions



Any refund request of prepaid excursions received by Azamara Cruises 4 days prior to sailing will be made in full (unless noted otherwise). Refund requests made on board after the Shore Excursion Office closes ticket sales for that particular port will not be accommodated.

Refund of Excursions Purchased On Board

Tours purchased on board may be refunded at any time prior to the Shore Excursion Office closing ticket sales for that particular port. Refund requests made on board after the Shore Excursion Office closes ticket sales for that particular port will not be accommodated. If notice of cancellation is received after closing date and hour, a refund can be assured only in the event of the ticket being resold.

Closing times will be published in the Daily Program. No refunds will be made for failure to use all of the described services included in the tour price. Should any tour have to be abandoned due to difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances. Please note that tour lengths noted in this brochure are approximate.

No refunds are made to any guest who might cancel, deviate, leave, or otherwise not utilize all of the services scheduled to be provided by an excursion. Members of any excursion who elect to leave the automobiles or motor coaches, in the shopping area, or elsewhere, must provide their own transportation at their own expense back to the landing place of the vessel. Should any such excursion, however, be abandoned through force majeure the best possible refunds will be arranged according to the circumstances.

Cancellations and Refunds of Overnight Excursions and Flightseeing Tours

Overnight Excursions and Flightseeing tours may be canceled and the full tour price refunded at any time up to 30 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise. A 10% cancellation fee will be applied to all cancellations made from 30 days to 15 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise. Due to the booking requirements in the countries visited, no cancellations or changes may be made within 14 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise, or on board the ship.

Cancellations

Shore Excursions are subject to cancellation or modification, depending on the number of guests participating. In the event of a tour cancellation or modification, the Shore Excursion Manager and/or staff will give advance notice. Certain tours have a minimum-booking requirement, or must be limited to a maximum number of participants. If the minimum number for participation is not achieved, the excursion will be cancelled. In this event, an alternative may be offered; otherwise, a full refund will be given.

Additional Information

GUIDE SERVICES AND TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT: In certain interesting but off the beaten track places, professional guides are at a premium. The best available and obtainable guides of competence are engaged. It is exceptional for drivers of public hire vehicles to speak any language but their own. Transportation equipment used for the shore excursions is the best available in the ports of call. In some ports, it is not possible to obtain buses or taxis equipped with air conditioning or bus or taxis with air conditioning that meets North American standards.

When choosing a tour, please keep in mind that you are a visitor in a foreign country; some luxuries to which you are accustomed may not be available. To get the most out of your excursion, please notice, feel, experience, and enjoy the local cultures, conditions, and customs.

With the popularity of some ports of call, the excursion itineraries and order of the actual tour may be changed at the discretion of the local operator, with or without notice, in order to give the best service possible under the prevailing local conditions.

ENTRANCE FEES: Entrance fees to all museums and sites are included in the price of the respective shore excursions unless otherwise stated. Occasionally, a small extra charge is levied if photographs are taken, and this is not included.

NIGHT EXCURSIONS vary throughout the world's cruise ports. Many hotels have international-type acts, others national dances or folklore shows. Some ports are renowned for nightlife while others are more conservative. We aim to take you to the most generally accepted shows, but do not expect to find Paris standards at every port of call. Check the charges before ordering extra refreshments, photographing, or recording.

WITHDRAWAL OF TOURS: The right is reserved to withdraw any tour, to limit membership in any tour, or to make alterations in the operation of any tour, which may be deemed advisable for the safety or convenience of guests.

ITINERARIES are expected to be operated as described in the brochure but the right is reserved to change or omit a place to be visited or the sequence of the tour, in accordance with conditions or circumstances prevailing at the time of tours, with or without previous notice,



bearing in mind the convenience and best interest and safety of guests. The right is also reserved to decline, to accept, or retain any person as a member of any party at any time.

Berlin (Warnemunde), Germany

Please note that tours to Berlin are full day and guests will be departing early in the morning and not returning to the vessel until late in the evening. A late dinner buffet will be served on board the ship upon the guests' return. Due to extensive construction occurring in Berlin, the numerous congresses and special events taking place in 2008, it may become necessary to substitute one or more of the listed sights with another venue. This is beyond the control of the local tour operator and Azamara Cruises. The order of the tours and the exact route/itinerary may vary depending on where the vessel will dock and local conditions.

Exterior walking portions of the listed tours will be conducted in all weather conditions (rain or shine). Guests are advised to take the appropriate weather gear and wear comfortable walking shoes. The best quality transportation has been obtained for the excursion program; however, all vehicles' air-conditioning systems may not be to North American standards.

WA38 - Sachsenhausen Memorial Camp

PRICE: ADULT: 199.00 / CHILD: 155.00 USD

DURATION: 11 Hours Approx.



The concentration camp in Sachsenhausen was one of the first built by the Nazis. It served as a blueprint for all the others that followed. That fact and the history of persecution make this site a must see in northern Germany. After viewing the Memorial Site, on which the emphasis of this tour is placed, you will also visit the Rheinsberg Palace and enjoy a city tour of Rostock.

Start your day with a relaxing coach ride through the rural Mecklenburg and Brandenburg passing by wide fields, green forests and lovely villages. During the trip of approximately 2 1/4 hours, your escort will provide snacks as well as information material about your destination. A restroom stop will be made along the way. Upon arrival in Sachsenhausen, you will meet your local tour guide.

Having arrived in at the Memorial Site, you will participate in a 2 hour guided tour of the camp housing political prisoners and dissidents from the 1930s onward. The camp was not a dedicated death camp like the numerous ones that followed, but thousands of prisoners died of starvation behind its barbed wire fences. The tour will include the execution chamber, where sporadic executions took place, the laundry, which is now a chapel, and the remainder of this austere prison.

After this moving stop, you will continue to the serene town of Rheinsberg for your lunch break. You will be served a traditional German lunch before you will tour the beautiful Rheinsberg Palace. Originally built in 1566, then rebuilt in 1740 after a fire, the palace served as a summer residence and hunting estate for Prussian kings such as Frederick Wilhelm I. As you will see, the palace's neo classical exterior blends beautifully into the lush country side and serves as an ideal backdrop for extraordinary pictures when its facade reflects in the lake along which it is located.

After leaving the castle, you will head back to the ship but not before taking a tour of the port town of Rostock. The city's walls and gates tell tales of its turbulent history. The originally Slavic city was, and is again, the capital of Mecklenburg. Danish rule and wars with Saxony influenced the city's history immensely. You should not miss taking a picture of Northern Europe's oldest University founded as early as 1419 before returning to your cruise ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over varying surfaces.

WA39 - A Nostalgic Puff - Molli Steam Train

DURATION: 4 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



We invite you to visit several of Mecklenburg-Pommern's most historic sites with us. We have chosen cities rich in history and combined them with some unconventional transportation to make this day unforgettable.

Our first stop will be the cathedral of the Bad Doberanian monastery which was founded over 800 years ago. The cathedral's interior which luckily survived the various major and minor wars, reveals the wealth of the Cistercian monks which prayed within its walls. The altars, opulent statues, and brilliant stained glass windows stand in stark contrast to the imposing gothic



brick exterior. During the tour you will have plenty of time to take in the site and have any questions answered by our competent tour guides.

After leaving the cathedral we make our way to Heligendamm, Germany's most historic seaside resort, the way people would have since 1886, by steam train. We will begin our voyage on the Molli steam train in the narrow city passages of originally Slavic Bad Doberan, along Europe's longest avenue of linden trees, past the equestrian center of Germany's oldest racehorse track, on to beautiful Heligendamm.

Following a short stroll along the seaside resort made famous by its 1793 founder Duke Frederick Franz I, and the healing properties of the water, we board our coaches to head to our last stop. Upon arrival in Klungsborn, we finally get to rest our feet while enjoying some coffee and cake in this coastal town. You may afterwards choose to do some shopping at the numerous local shops or just roam on the board walk until our busses will return you to the cruise ship. We hope that we have sparked an interest in some of the historic sites in the area, and that you will use your limited time here to give us the chance to enjoy them as much as we do.

WA40 - A Taste of Rostock

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.



During this tour you will have the chance to learn more about the glory of the Hanseatic League and be introduced to local beer and food.

Your journey starts with a 25 minute ride in a comfortable coach into the city of Rostock. On your way ,you will be introduced to port of Rostock while you view Rostock's different districts in the early hours of the morning.

A city tour leading you past the University Square with its impressive fountain and the main building of the University will reveal the secrets of the wealth of ideas in Rostock. Founded in 1419, the alma mater is the oldest university to be found in the Baltic. Enjoy a walk through the consecrated gardens of the Holy Cross Convent before making your way to the new market. View the oldest building that houses the town's library today, as well as awe-inspiring St. Mary's Church to listen to stories out of its history. Arriving at the new Market, your guide will point out the town hall and the old post building.

After your guide has familiarized you with some facts about the 800 years of history that have shaped Rostock, your will visit a lively microbrewery in the port of Rostock. There you will participate in the beer tasting along with a typical pretzel surrounded by a rustic atmosphere.

Following the refreshments, you will be taken back to Warnemunde by boat while enjoying impressions of Rostock's skyline.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over varying surfaces. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended. The first stop of the tour was without a doubt the primary symbol of the Cold War: the 4.318 ft long East Side Gallery which you will see is the longest remaining segment of the infamous Berlin Wall. From there, you will visit one of the most famous border crossing points connecting East and West Berlin, the Checkpoint Charlie lying in the former American sector. It was the site of many escape attempts and a touchy tank stand-off in 1961.

Your tour will continue on in what used to be East Berlin, with a stop in the former French quarter at the Gendarmenmarkt. A ride underneath the linden trees of Unter den Linden, Berlin's prestigious promenade during Prussian times, will take you to the World War II Memorial and Berlin's most recognizable sight, the Brandenburg Gate. From here it is only a short walk over to the brand new government district to the Parliament building, the Reichstag. Your tour starts at the impressive New Synagogue. After being nearly completely destroyed during the war it finally regained its position in the Jewish community by holding regular services. Continue to the next highlight: an extended inside visit of the Jewish Museum, a distinctive building designed by Daniel Libeskind. Your 60-minute guided tour through the exhibition takes you through 2,000 years of Jewish history. See the Garden of Exile with its 49 pillars and the Holocaust Tower. After this emotional experience you will have time on your own to examine the largest Jewish museum in Europe closer. Use your time to see Moses Mendelssohn's glasses, browse the books in the gift store or enjoy your deluxe snack box served in the Liebermann's restaurant.

After lunch continue to the Brandenburg Gate and the Reichstag in the political and historical center of Berlin. The sights passed and visited are subject to change due to weather conditions, high-water or rough seas. The Captain has the right to cancel, change, shorten or abort the tour at anytime due to weather conditions, high water or rough seas.

HE73 - Helsinki Walking Tour

DURATION: 3 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



Helsinki's tree-lined avenues, graceful parks, and distinctive architecture are wonderful for a walking tour.

A bus will take you from the pier to Senate Square with the Lutheran Church, the Senate Building, and the University with its neo-Classical atmosphere.

From here, walk through the downtown and pass by the central railway station of Eliel Saarinen to see the National Theater and Sanoma Talo. Also pass the Kiasma museum of contemporary art, Finlandia Hall, the National Museum and Parliament House.

A cup of coffee or tea will be served with a pastry at a waterfront cafe near the Opera House. Continue your walk from here to Toolo residential area, through Hesperia Park and onto the famous Rock Church.



Your walking tour ends at the Rock Church, from where you will be taken by coach back to the pier. When the tour is operated as a morning departure, you will have the option of staying in the downtown area and returning to the ship on your own.

Note: The walk covers approximately three miles over paved surfaces and gravel. It is relatively flat except for the slope at the Rock Church. Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended. In the event a special function is being held at the Rock Church, an inside visit will not be possible.

HE79 - Helsinki, Porvoo & Countryside with Refreshments

This tour includes some of the highlights of Helsinki, a visit to Porvoo and the Savijarvi Farm where refreshments are served at the family's home.

Leaving the harbor, you will pass Embassy Park, the Market Square, Uspenski Orthodox Cathedral and the Presidential Palace. You will head towards Sipoo and Savijarvi farm (an active family run horse-breeding farm). At the farm you will receive a personal welcome by the Family and get an introduction to the farm and the way of life. The children of the family will then show you the different horses.

The family will then invite you into their home for refreshments including coffee and cake with an assortment of Finnish Berries topped with whipped cream and caramel sauce

After refreshments, you will enjoy a sightseeing tour of Porvoo, the second oldest town in Finland dating back to 1346. You will make a photo stop at the Old Bridge of Porvoo, which offers magnificent views of the town. Then walk the cobblestone streets of this charming old wooden town. You will also have an opportunity to explore on your own.

Begin your drive towards Helsinki, where you will make a stop at the Senate Square before returning to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 mile over even and cobblestone surfaces with some inclines and some steps. Tour sequence may vary in order to avoid congestion. There is approximately 30 minutes of free time in Porvoo.

HE80 - Helsinki by Bike

Explore Helsinki by Jopo, the famous Finnish bike known as "everyone's bicycle." After a safety briefing, head into the Finnish Capital and ride along paths by city parks, waterfronts and residential and commercial areas, and experience the city from a unique perspective. View Helsinki's main city beach, Hietaranta, and Sibelius Park to see the monument to Finland's world famous composer. Pass through the residential district of Töölö to the shores of Töölö Bay. Stop for photos at the eastern Harbour and capture the beauty of Katajanokka Island. At Market Square, walk with your bike and safely enjoy the colorful sights and sounds of one of the most popular tourist attractions in the city. Proceed to the exclusive waterfront homes



of Diplomats and the popular Kaivopuisto Park with scenic views across to the impressive Suomenlinna Island Fortress. A final stop will be made to view the traditional spring time custom of carpet washing. Pass the well-known local small boat marina of Merisatama, bringing you back to your ship, and completing your introduction to this beautiful Baltic capital.

Note: Minimum required in order for the tour to operate. Guests must be in good health and be comfortable riding a bicycle with foot brakes for this moderately easy tour that includes approximately 10 miles (2.5 hours of cycling) over mostly flat paved and gravel cycle paths. Some mild undulations and one gentle hill will be encountered. All bikes used are unisex style city bikes. Helmets are provided. Upon arrival in the Hanseatic metropolis you will embark your private chartered boat and start your scenic cruise on the Outer Alster Lake. You will pass by the finest residential areas of Hamburg with beautifully architected manor houses and impressive flower gardens which cannot be seen from the public streets. Experience the city's wealthiest residents and their lifestyle.

The cruise continues towards Hamburg's city center along the lovely Alster Park, one of the favorite spots for Hamburgers to relax, and ends right at the famous Jungfernstieg.

Sightseeing continues with a stop at the impressive St. Michael's Church. The magnificent copper-plated spire of the baroque church still is a famous landmark for mariners when sailing into Hamburg. During your guided inside visit you will see the spectacular organ with its 6,600 pipes before continuing for lunch in a traditional restaurant in the city center

During your orientation tour you won't miss such highlights as the Town Hall, the Stock Exchange, the 890 ft tall Telegraph Tower and the famed Planten and Bloomen Park before heading back to the ship in Travemunde.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 miles over varying surfaces. Please note that for the July 6th call, all shops will be closed.

TV02 - Hanseatic Lubeck & Fairytale Schwerin

Start your sightseeing in the Hanseatic town and UNESCO World Heritage Site Lubeck. After a short coach transfer of approximately 25 minutes from Travemunde you will start with a guided walk from the impressive Holsten Gate, Lubeck's most famous landmark. During your visit you have the opportunity to view the St. Mary's Church, built at the end of the 12th century, and see the largest mechanical organ in the world. Other highlights include the medieval Town Hall, the former Schiffergesellschaft and the arcades of the Market Square.

After a 1.5 hours scenic ride through the beautiful Mecklenburg countryside, your second stop today will be the Mecklenburg state capital Schwerin with its beautiful fairy tale castle. During a private guided tour of this beautiful example of Neo-Renaissance architecture you will see many of the impressive rooms and their treasures. Continue for lunch served in a local restaurant in the city center.

Your tour continues with a one-hour walking tour through the medieval part of Schwerin. Your guide will point out highlights such as the State Theater, the museum in the Old Gardens, the traditional half-timbered houses surrounding the market square, the Dome Cathedral and the old Schelf-Town with its maze of narrow alleys.

After that comprehensive day re-board the coach for the 1.5 hour ride back to your ship in Travemunde.

As you walk through Lubeck, you will find scenery recalling the old days of the Hanseatic Union, especially because of the narrow streets, little backyards and brick stone facades. During the city tour, you will get an impression of an old town with numerous squares, passing by the Holsten Gate, the old harbor, St. Mary's Church, St. Peter's Church, and the beautiful Town Hall which was built in the 13th century.

At the conclusion of your walking tour, stop at the leading Wine House in Lubeck. Here you will be invited to try 4-5 different sorts of wine, including the famous Rotspons, which grows in that region. After that little "lesson", continue your tour enjoying some free time before returning to your coach which will bring you right back to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over varying surfaces. Tour only available on June 1 and July 07 sail dates.

TV04 - Placid Lakes & Dreamy Castle

This tour takes you into the scenic countryside surrounding Lubeck and Travemunde! During your scenic cruise you can enjoy coffee and cake on board. Remember to bring your camera for taking pictures of the beautiful scenery.

Afterwards you will re-board your coach for a ride to Eutin. Located in the center of the "Holsteinische Schweiz" natural park, the former princely residence town of Eutin offers a great variety of opportunities. Visit the Eutin Castle! Since its foundation in the late Middle Ages right up to 1918, the castle and the city have been closely linked to the ancient Schleswig-Holstein nobility. The Castle hosts priceless furniture of the 18th and 19th centuries and the biggest portrait collection in Northern Germany. After your one-hour guided walk you will have some free time to explore the gardens, the lake shore or just walk over to the old Eutin market square before returning back to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1 mile over varying surfaces.

TV05 - Cycling Along the Baltic Sea

Enjoy a relaxing bike ride around the town of Travemunde and take in the views along the fascinating coastline! Once "saddled" after a short introduction to the bicycles, you will leave the quayside by bike for an easy but refreshing tour of Travemunde and its surroundings. Travel past the bustling promenade and pier before continuing along the spectacular coastline - the Brodten Shore - and enjoy magnificent views of the Bay of Lubeck.

You will cycle through the national park of Niendorf and return through the lovely countryside back to Travemunde. Your ride won't miss the residential suburbs of the charming seaside resort with its beautiful villas dating back to Victorian times, as well



as the center with its reed-roofed, half-timbered houses and quaint little shopping streets.

Half way through, stop for a well-deserved refreshment break. Don't miss the fantastic view of Travemunde's skyline before heading back to the harbor side!

Note: There is approximately 15 miles of cycling involved.

TV06 - Lubeck Cultural Capital of the North

After the approximately 25 minutes drive to Lubeck, you will explore all major spots of interest in the historical part of the Hanseatic town and furthermore enjoy a culinary stop at the world famous Niederegger Cafe.

Lubeck has preserved its original flair and gives a real impression of an old Hanseatic town such as narrow cobbled streets, brick stone churches, and scenic backyards. Your 2.5 hours guided walk will start from the impressive Holsten Gate. During the visit of the St. Mary's Church, built at the end of the 12th century, you will see the largest mechanical organ in the world. More major highlights are the Almshouse Court, the Buddenbrook House, the Schiffergesellschaft, and the St. Jakob's Church.

The main attraction is, however, the impressive Town Hall, which will be explored more thoroughly during a guided inside visit. The Town Hall, one of the finest and oldest in Germany, was built in the 13th century. All the riches and glory of the city's history are manifest in the building's interior.

After that comprehensive city tour enjoy some free time at the famous Niederegger Cafe for local souvenir shopping, before returning back to the ship in Travemunde.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over varying surfaces. Entrance to churches may be restricted on sundays due to mass programs. In this case an explanation will be given from the outside.



St. Petersburg, Russia

The order of the tours and the exact route/itinerary may vary depending upon where the vessel will dock and local conditions. The best quality transportation has been obtained for the excursions in St. Petersburg; however, the vehicles' air-conditioning system may not be to North American standards. Not all venues, museums, and attractions are air-conditioned; therefore, guests should dress accordingly. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for every shore excursion.

Important Information Regarding Visa Requirements in Russia.

During your three-day visit to St. Petersburg, a very special program of excursions has been planned. Guests who have purchased one of the available excursions will not require a visa while on that particular excursion. If you would like to visit St. Petersburg after taking a tour, you will need to obtain a Russian visa.

Please be advised that without a visa, shoreside visitation is limited to the period of the excursion and you will not be permitted to leave the ship outside of excursion hours. If you do have a visa, we still recommend advance purchase of excursions as some tours have limited capacity.

Guests who wish to sightsee independently or sightsee outside of Azamara Cruises shore excursion hours **MUST** obtain an individual Russian Visa before leaving home. Should you wish to obtain an individual visa for Russia, you will need to have the contracting company (tour agent or travel agency) provide you with the necessary Visa Support Letter and documentation. It will then be necessary to contact the visa service of your choice, such as Passport Express where you can call for, e-mail or download information, forms and fees or the Russian Embassy for the procedures to follow.

Guests who have not purchased one of the available excursions, do not possess a Russia visa, or whose visa is not properly supported by the proper documentation will not be permitted ashore in St. Petersburg by local Russian Immigrations.

Guests on an independent car or van excursion purchased from Azamara Cruises do not need an individual visa to participate in this program.

All nationalities should consult their appropriate consulate to define their needs for this call. Visas cannot be issued on board the ship. In order to receive a Russian visa, a guest must have a valid passport, which does not expire within 30 days of the last day of the cruise.

Independent Car or Van Excursions: In addition to the normal assortment of excursions, Azamara Cruises offers guests a chance to explore St. Petersburg and the countryside via private car or van with a driver and qualified English or foreign language-speaking guide. Please refer to the Independent Car or Van Excursions for more information about this program.

Shopping and Currency Regulations: Due to the evolving political and economic situation in Russia, persons visiting the country must adhere to regulations concerning the use of foreign currency and the purchase of some items in St. Petersburg. Once on board the ship, you will be advised of the current policies concerning shopping and currency regulations.

PZA2 - Moscow & the Mysterious Kremlin

DURATION: 17 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



This trip gives a unique opportunity to see the highlights of the Russian capital in one day. Constructed in the 12th century as an oak-wood fortress, Moscow later became the residence of the Russian Tsars and today it is the seat of the Russian president and a huge museum complex in the open air.

Accompanied by a St. Petersburg guide, you will be transferred to the St. Petersburg airport for a one-hour flight to Moscow. At the airport in Moscow you will be greeted by a local guide who will accompany you during the whole trip. Your sightseeing begins with a drive to the center of Moscow. On your way, you will see how the years of communism have affected the



people's life and the architecture of the city.

Your first stop will be at the world-famous Red Square. Stretched along the Kremlin Eastern wall, this place has been the arena of many important historical and political events in the life of the country: religious processions, public executions, Soviet time parades, and fireworks on May 9, 1945. The ensemble of the square is dominated by the Kremlin and the Lenin Mausoleum that stands by its walls. Echoing the Kremlin is the picturesque multi-domed Church of St. Basil the Blessed on the south side of the square and the pointed tent roofs of the State History Museum, the largest museum of Russian history in the world, on the north side. To the east the square is bordered by the building of GUM, the largest department store in the country. GUM's interior is an interesting, appealing blend of classical architecture and modern decoration. After the stop at the Red Square you will head to one of the best Moscow hotels for a coffee break. This short rest will give you energy to continue exploring the very heart of Moscow - the Kremlin. Nowhere else one can sense so clearly the country's past and present as in the Kremlin.

The Kremlin is an old fortress, the most important historical and political center of Russia. Today it is also the seat of the Russian president. Your walking tour of the Kremlin will include all the most important sites. You will visit the Armory Chamber and the treasury of Russian tsars that houses a collection of unique jewelry, court regalia, armor, coronation dresses, golden carriages, and some of the fabulous and priceless Easter Eggs by Karl Faberge.

You will see the Kremlin's compositional center and the Cathedral Square, absolutely striking in its beauty. Here ceremonies connected with the coronations of the Russian rulers were held, the heads of the Russian Church, metropolitans and patriarchs were chosen, foreign ambassadors were received, church processions took place and theatrical mysteries were enacted. Three main cathedrals - the Assumption, the Annunciation and the Archangel Michael, all decorated with numerous golden domes, surround the square. You will pay a visit to one of the Kremlin Cathedrals.

The neighboring Ivan Square boasts two remarkable specimens of Russian metal-work, namely, the 890-millimeter caliber Tsar Cannon which weighs 40 tons and the largest bell in the world, the 200-ton Tsar Bell. From here, you will have a unique chance to view the Grand Kremlin Palace. Located along the Kremlin's South wall and overlooking the Moscow River, today the Palace is part of the President's ceremonial Kremlin residence used for holding official receptions by the President of Russian Federation. This is where the presidential inauguration ceremony and top-level negotiations are held together with the signing of major international treaties. It is also the place where state awards and credentials are presented and where receptions marking important state occasions are conducted.

Continue your tour with a short ride on the Moscow metro. City residents are justifiably proud of their metro system. It is an efficient and reliable means of public transport and also a kind of museum with many stations richly decorated with mosaics, crystal chandeliers and marble columns and walls.

Reboard your coach for an opportunity to rest your weary feet and continue your panoramic tour passing many of Moscow's famous landmarks. We will take you to the Sparrow Hills, an observation platform on the steep bank of the Moscow River where you will enjoy a panoramic view of the whole city and see the famous Moscow State University, one of the main scientific and educational centers in Russia. In the evening you will be invited to a very special dinner in the top Moscow restaurant and the Writers Club. The building is more than 100 years old. The exquisite interior with its warm fireplaces, glorious heraldry and antique balustrades creates an atmosphere of an old Russian noble house. You will taste traditional Russian dishes, have a shot of vodka and relax after such a full and exciting day.

Following dinner you will return to the airport for your flight back to St. Petersburg.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over various surfaces and approximately 150+ steps. Please take into consideration that this is an extensive walking tour and is not recommended for persons with walking difficulties. The transfer to/from the St. Petersburg Airport is approximately 45 minutes each way, dependent upon traffic conditions. Comfortable clothing and walking shoes are recommended. Being the seat of the Russian Government, the Kremlin is subject to closures without prior notice. Should this occur, other Moscow attractions will be substituted at the discretion of the local tour operator. The route/itinerary may vary. No refund can be guaranteed if canceled less than 20 days prior to arrival in port. Space is limited but a minimum is required to operate. Due to Russian manifest requirements, this tour must be purchased in advance of boarding the vessel and may not be available for sale once on board. Please complete the guest information details. minimum not be met by 30 days prior to the start of the cruise, the tour will be canceled.

PZA3 - The Best of St. Petersburg

Start your day on a trip to the Hermitage. You will visit the following buildings of the Hermitage complex: the Winter Palace, Small Hermitage, Old Hermitage and the New Hermitage. Following a delicious Russian lunch the buses will take you to the Peter and Paul Fortress and you will visit the Peter and Paul Cathedral there.

After the visit to the Peter and Paul Fortress you will continue your city tour and will have a great opportunity to have a look at the city from the water. Your boat will pass by most attractive rivers and canals flowing along granite embankments. You will pass palaces and mansions of Russian aristocratic families, such as Yusupov Palace, Stroganov Palace and Michael's Castle, built in the 18th and 19th centuries with facades overlooking the water. After enjoying the view of the marvelous multicolored Church of Our Savior on the Spilled Blood, you proceed to the Fontanka. You will pass by the famous Summer Gardens, the oldest public park in St. Petersburg, and the first Summer Palace of Peter the Great.

Note: Guests must be able to walk a total of approximately 2.5 miles over varied surfaces and 120 + steps. There are a lot of steps on the boat pier and it is not accessible to wheelchairs. Participants should take care while entering/exiting the river boats. Hermitage Museum: There is limited seating inside the museum and no air-conditioning. Large carry bags, umbrellas, and heavy coats are not permitted, and must be checked prior to entering the museum. Camera and video fees for the Hermitage Museum are included in the tour cost. Flash photos are not usually permitted in areas displaying paintings. There are small gift shops and stalls throughout the museum. Peter & Paul Fortress: Camera and video fees for the Fortress are included in the tour cost. Flash photo restrictions might apply in the Cathedral.

PZA4 - St. Petersburg Highlights

Your first photo stop will be at the St. Isaac's Square dominated by the majestic Saint Isaac Cathedral. Pass the Palace Square, have a look at the Alexander Column, an important focal point for this architectural ensemble. On the square's northern side stands the picturesque Baroque Winter Palace - former imperial residence.

Drive across the Neva River and view the Spit of Vasiliievsky Island, flanked by two Rostral Columns originally lighthouses, in olden days guiding ships through the busy port of St. Petersburg. There you can enjoy the magnificent view of the Neva River in its widest part. In front of you is the Peter and Paul Fortress, the first structure of the city. In the centre of the fortress you will see the Peter and Paul Cathedral, designed by Domenico Tresini. The coach drives past the Artillery Museum and passes along the Petrograd side where Art Nouveau architecture flourished at the end of the 19th century. The next stop is at the Aurora cruiser, which signaled the start of the revolution in 1917 by firing a single blank shot from its bow gun. The coach proceeds to one of the main landmarks of St. Petersburg the Church of Resurrection on the Spilled Blood.

From here you will reach Nevsky Prospect - not just St. Petersburg's but Russia's most famous street. It is lined with magnificent palaces, churches and theatrical buildings. This street is the main shopping area of St. Petersburg and some of the best shops can be found around Gostiny Dvor Arcade and Passage. On the way back to the ship you pass the Decembrists Square and will have a look at the Bronze Horseman statue.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 200 yards over cobblestone surfaces with 2 to 5 steps to enter/exit the coach. No interior visits will be made on this excursion. Tour order may vary in order to avoid traffic congestion.

PZA6 - Parks & Fountains of Peterhof (Exterior visit)

PRICE: ADULT: 54.00 / CHILD: 34.00 USD

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.



Take a tour to Peterhof (also known as Petrodvorets) the town of palaces, fountains and gardens, the most brilliant of all the

former summer residences of the Russian tsars conceived by Peter the Great to rival Versailles. In the course of a one-hour drive you will see different parts of the city including the new areas of St. Petersburg and the countryside. Among the numerous sights on the way you will enjoy a picturesque view of the recently built complex at Strelna, officially known as the State Palace of Congresses. It consists of the restored and reconstructed Constantine Palace, its surrounding garden (newly laid out), and the visitor and service buildings. You will also pass the early 18th century Road Palace of Peter the Great, the parks of Alexandria - former residence of Nicholas I and the beautiful Peter and Paul Cathedral designed in the spirit of the 16th-17th century Russian architecture. After your tour of the grounds your guide will lead you to the parking lot where the buses will be awaiting to take you back to the city.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over gravel paths, cobblestones and even surfaces with approximately 200 steps. Guests are required to walk approximately 0.25 mile from the coach parking area to the Park's main entrance. Please be aware that the Peterhof fountains are subject to maintenance work without advance notification. No interior visit to the Peterhof Palace will be made on this tour. This tour will operate in all weather conditions so participants should take appropriate weather gear (jacket or umbrella) with them. Due to the walking involved in this tour, it is not recommended for guests with walkers or wheelchairs.

PZA7 - Hermitage Splendour

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.



Since the time of Catherine the Great the Staterooms of the Winter Royal Residence in St. Petersburg were opened for evening musical receptions organized by the Tsarina for her friends and foreign guests. She called the rooms for these receptions "hermitage" - a place where she could forget about state affairs and hardships of a monarch. Catherine the Great would send her invitations to smart, talented people who could amuse Her Majesty by an interesting conversation and share a cup of coffee with her. She would show them new purchases for her rapidly growing collection of European paintings and treat her guests to some beautiful music - another fashion of the time. During these evening musical parties Catherine the Great transformed herself into a hospitable lady, who conducted without ceremony. To revive this exquisite tradition of the 18th century, we are happy to offer you this unique opportunity of visiting the Hermitage Museum at night when you can enjoy its beautiful collections, avoiding the usual crowds.

Your guide will take you up the Jordan staircase that will strike you with its splendor, the glimmer of the golden stucco work and the dazzling whiteness of the marble statues. Having reached the upper landing you will walk through the Winter Palace superb staterooms: the Field-marshal's Hall, Small Throne Room meant to commemorate Peter the Great and his deeds, the Emblem Hall with its vast gilded columns, the Gallery of 1812 displaying portraits of Russian military heroes of the Napoleonic war, the Hall of St. George fitted in Cararra marble and gilt bronze. The floor parquet made up of 16 varieties of wood is a miracle reflection of the ceiling motif. You proceed to the Small Hermitage and find yourselves in the Pavilion Hall with its slender marble columns supporting an elegant gallery and 28 scintillating cut-glass chandeliers. A real gem in the Hermitage collection is the famous Peacock Clock in a glass cage made by a celebrated English clockmaker in the middle 18th century and presented to Catherine II by her favorite, prince Potyomkin. The "clock" represents a peacock on a gilded tree branch (completed with gilded leaves), an owl in a cage, and a rooster.

You enter the Old Hermitage which comprises the 13th - 16th century Italian art collection. Here on display are two paintings by Leonardo Da Vinci: the Madonna with a Flower and the Litta Madonna, an early work by Rafael - the Connestabile Madonna and a later work by him the Holy Family. The Crouching Boy is the only work by Michelangelo in Russia. The Venetian school of art dominates with Judith by Giordgione and an array of works by Titian: Repentant Mary Magdalene, Danae and St. Sebastian. The highlight of the evening is the Gala Ballet Concert on the stage of the Hermitage theatre - the oldest theatrical buildings in St. Petersburg constructed more than 200 years ago for Catherine the Great and court elite. This masterpiece of architecture reminds of an antique amphitheatre - proportions and richness of decoration.

Tonight the curtain will go up and you will enjoy the Gala Ballet Concert which consists of extracts from the world recognized outstanding ballets like Swan Lake, Nutcracker, Giselle and Sleeping Beauty, which have enjoyed an enduring popularity for centuries and can be found in the repertoire of most classical ballet companies in the world. You will be deeply moved by a timeless love story told in the mysterious language of classical dance. During your tour you will be offered a glass of champagne in the Foyer of the Hermitage Theatre. A jacket is recommended for gentlemen.



Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1,2 miles over even and cobblestone surfaces. There is limited seating inside the museum and no air-conditioning. There are approximately 125 steps covering 2 stories. Large carry bags, umbrellas, and heavy coats are not permitted, and must be checked prior to entering the museum. PZA8 - Tsarskoye Selo: Catherine Palace & Park

This tour will take you to one of the most splendid royal summer residences - Tsarskoye Selo. You start the tour of the palace from the Great staircase by Monighetty which takes you to the state rooms on the first floor. The interior consists of a seemingly interminable succession of state-rooms, which give the impression of a golden corridor. Of special interest is the Amber Room of the palace that was once considered to be the "Eighth Wonder of the World".

After the tour of the palace you will enjoy a short walk in the park. The 1400 acres of grounds are dotted with charming pavilions set around the central lake. Nearest to the palace are Cameron's sumptuous Agate Rooms to which he added a covered gallery where the busts of 30 of Catherine's favorite philosophers were placed. The romantic landscape of the park is animated with the neo-gothic Admiralty, Chesma column, Turkish bath, Marble Bridge, Chinese pagoda, the Grotto pavilion and the Hermitage pavilion.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 mile over gravel paths and even surfaces with approximately 45 steps. Special shoe covers must be worn when touring the palace. Camera and video fees for Catherine's Palace are included in the tour cost. Flash photos are usually not permitted in areas displaying paintings. There is a gift store in the Palace and local vendors near the bus park.

PZA9 - Journey to Historical Novgorod

For a taste of authentic old Russia take a trip to Novgorod - one of the most ancient Russian cities located in the country's North-West, near the site where River Volkhov takes its start from Lake Ilmen.

The tour begins with a 3-hour drive to Novgorod that lies 189 km south-east of St. Petersburg. On the way you will see the scenic countryside with small villages and traditional Russian wooden houses punctuating the landscape. On arrival to Novgorod you will enjoy some tea and coffee with Russian pastry at one of the city's hotels. Your tour begins with a visit to the Novgorod Kremlin - the heart of the old town. On the territory of the Kremlin you will pay a visit to the St. Sophia Cathedral. In the Kremlin's central square you will find the "The Millennium of Russia" monument designed by Mikhail Mikeshin (1862). It is a unique document in bronze immortalizing alongside with outstanding Russian state figures all those who greatly contributed to the development of the country: its culture, science, art and literature. Following the tour of the Kremlin, you will proceed to the Volkhov River opposite bank by a foot-bridge and find yourselves on the territory of another outstanding open-air museum - the Yaroslav's Court and ancient trade yard featuring numerous 12th - 16th century architectural monuments: the Cathedral of St. Nicholas, churches of St. John-The Baptist, Paraskeva-Pyatnitsa, Myrrh-Bearing Women and others. You will be invited for a traditional Russian meal to one of the city's best restaurants.

Following lunch, the buses will take you to the Yuriev Monastery founded in the 12th century by Prince Yaroslav the Wise. You will be amazed by the striking beauty of the St. George Cathedral (1119) - another masterpiece of ancient Russian architecture. On the way to the monastery a stop will be made at the open-air architectural-ethnographic museum "Vitoslavlitsy" that provides a whole complex of genuine 16th - 17th century wooden architecture, including churches, wooden peasant huts, flour mills, store-houses brought here from different parts of the Novgorod Region.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2.5 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces with approximately 40 to 75 steps. Due to the walking and stair climbing involved on this tour, it is not recommended for guests with walkers or wheelchairs.

Revive the luxury of the 18th-century Imperial Russian court on an evening visit to one of the most amazing royal palaces. Following a 17-mile journey south, you will be greeted by Royal Guards in front of the lavish Catherine Palace in Pushkin, former Tsarskoye Selo. The palace's stunning 300 m long aqua blue and white facade is adorned with a profusion of columns, pilasters and ornamental window framings. This summer residence is renowned for its splendid interior with the finest of furnishings and china.

Inside the palace you will view an exhibition of the Romanovs' Portraits and private rooms before entering the Golden Suite of Rooms where the world famous Amber Room is located. The Amber Room of the palace was once considered to be the "Eighth Wonder of the World". Presented in 1717 to Peter the Great by King Friedrich Wilhelm, the famous amber panels were looted by the Nazis during the siege of Leningrad in 1941-44, dispatched to Germany and never seen again. Preserved photographs and archives helped the Russian art experts to fashion thin amber pieces so that they exactly match the original in shape and color and to carve fine ornaments, thus recreating the legendary work of art. And once again the eye is mesmerized and blinded by the wealth and warmth of the amber tones, from bright yellow to a deep red.

You will proceed to the Grand Hall where a gala champagne reception will be held to the sounds of classical music. The arrangement of large windows and mirrors in the spaces of wall between them, as well as the multiple reflections in the mirrors, gilded carvings and the vast ceiling painting - all these elements of rich decor create the illusion of infinite space. As in days gone by, Catherine II will mix with her honored guests while the orchestra provides musical accompaniment. Following the reception you will descend the Main staircase to the courtyard where the pageantry continues. The Imperial Guards will parade to the music and a carriage will arrive with the royal couple that will dance one last time before departing.

A short motor coach drive will take you to the Imperial Carriage Museum. Here, enjoy a guided inspection of the 23 coaches by well-known Russian and Western European masters of the 18th and 19th centuries, which once carried Russia's highest nobility. You will then proceed to one of the best restaurants outside St. Petersburg to enjoy excellent Russian cuisine and a performance by a Russia folkloric group will heighten the magic of this special event.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 mile over gravel paths and even surfaces with approximately 45 steps. Special shoe covers must be worn when touring the palace. Camera and video fees for Catherine's Palace are included in the tour cost. Flash photos are usually not permitted in areas displaying paintings.

PZB3 - Behind the Scenes of the Hermitage

Your coach will take you to the Hermitage Repository in Staraya Derevnya that was officially opened on May 16, 2003. The repository occupies an area of over 16,000 sq. m. and it is equipped with a system of microclimate and other state-of-the-art technologies of storage, restoration, information and security.

Unlike traditional storage areas, the new center is open to the general public. On a tour of about one kilometer's length, visitors are introduced to the basic principles and conditions of the storage of works of art. The new Repository houses collections of the Departments of Western European Art, the History of Russian Culture, the East and the Archaeology of Eastern Europe, as well as the Laboratory for the Scientific Restoration of Easel Paintings.

On the ground and first floors of the Repository for the first time visitors will be able to view the 18th century carriages and related items from the State Hermitage collection in the open repository display. The collection of Russian furniture of about 2,500 pieces is stored on the second floor of the Repository, encompassing a long period from Peter the Great's time (first quarter of the 18th century) to the early 20th century. On the fourth floor you will admire the painting collection of the Department of Russian Culture that includes about 3,500 works by Russian artists of the 17th - early 20th century over half of which are portraits, representing a priceless pictorial resource for art historians.



After the tour enjoy a delicious Russian lunch in one of the best restaurants and continue your tour with the visit to the Hermitage museum. No visit to St. Petersburg would be complete without a tour of the world-famous Hermitage Museum - the "Crown Jewel" on the museum list in St. Petersburg. Founded in 1764 as a private museum of Catherine the Great to which only she and her closest courtiers had access, today it is Russia's largest art museum that owns an astounding collection of about 3 million pieces of art. The collection occupies four buildings: the Winter Palace, former official residence of the imperial family, the Small Hermitage, the only custom-built museum which served as Catherine's retreat from the bustle of the court, the Old Hermitage and the New Hermitage opened to public in 1852.

The Hermitage Museum is a must see on your visit to St. Petersburg. Due to time constraints, your tour will not include all the exhibits, but rather a concentration of the more popular areas. The approximate time spent in the museum is 1.5 to 2 hours. The approximate time at the Repository is 1 hour.

Note: Guests must be able to walk a total of approximately 3 miles over varied surfaces. There is limited seating inside the museum and no air-conditioning. There are approximately 175 steps covering two floors. There are 2 wheelchair accessible lifts, however, 4 to 7 steps must be traversed to reach them. One of the lifts goes to the second floor only, the other one goes to the second and third floors. Large carry bags, umbrellas, and heavy coats are not permitted, and must be checked prior to entering the museum. Camera and video fees for the Hermitage Museum are included in the tour cost. Flash photos are not usually permitted in areas displaying paintings. There are small gift shops and stalls throughout the museum.

Your tour starts with a drive to one of the most picturesque squares of the city - the Square of Arts. Here you will find the world-known Russian Museum, the Museum of Ethnography, Academic Maly Theater of Opera and Ballet and the State Philharmonic Society. The Square is dominated by the famous monument to Alexander Pushkin by sculptor Mikhail Anikushin put up in 1957.

From the Square of Arts you will proceed to the Griboedov Canal - another important historical waterway. To the right along the canal you will see the Church on the Spilled Blood. Enjoy a cup of Russian tea with some Russian pastry and a short rest at a local restaurant right by the Church on the Spilled Blood. After an inside visit to this church, you will have an opportunity to do some shopping at a local flea market. Then, continue along the Moika River and Mikhailovsky Garden towards the Mikhailovsky Castle, probably the most mysterious building in the city. Stop for a photo opportunity while you listen to the guide's story.

From the Castle you will walk to one of the most picturesque places in St. Petersburg - the Maple Alley. There you will admire an impressive monument to Peter the Great which was erected here in 1800 by order of Emperor Paul I. From this point you will board your coaches and return back to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over even surfaces, inclines and steps. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Take a tour to Peterhof (also known as Petrodvorets) the town of palaces, fountains and gardens, the most brilliant of all the former summer residences of the Russian tsars conceived by Peter the Great to rival Versailles.

In the course of a one-hour drive you will see different parts of the city including the new areas of St. Petersburg and the countryside. Among the numerous sights on the way you will enjoy a picturesque view of the recently built complex at Strelna, officially known as the State Palace of Congresses. It consists of the restored and reconstructed Constantine Palace, its surrounding garden (newly laid out), and the visitor and service buildings. You will also pass the early 18th century Road



Palace of Peter the Great, the parks of Alexandria - former residence of Nicholas I and the beautiful Peter and Paul Cathedral designed in the spirit of the 16th-17th century Russian architecture. Upon arrival to Peterhof you will proceed to the Upper Park designed as a French formal garden and enter the Grand Palace for an hour-long tour. Following the tour of the Grand Palace you will descend into the Lower Gardens, a 300-acre fountain park with a number of pavilions and palaces overlooking the Gulf of Finland.

After an hour-long tour of the grounds your guide will lead you to the pier from where a comfortable hydrofoil will take you right to the center of St. Petersburg. It is from the sea that you will be able to enjoy once again a majestic panorama unfolding before you with the most prominent landmark.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over gravel paths, cobblestones and even surfaces with approximately 200+ steps. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Afterwards, tour the Great Choral Synagogue, one of the most ornate synagogues in Europe and have the opportunity to talk with some representatives of the local Jewish community. During your visit you will have the unique opportunity to hear a concert performed by the Synagogue cantor and other Jewish musicians. Next, visit the Small Synagogue located nearby which is used for everyday services.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately .80 mile over uneven and cobblestone surfaces with approximately 75 - 90 steps. Due to the walking involved in this tour, it is not recommended for guests with walkers or wheelchairs.

On this tour learn about the evolution of Russia and its politics as you visit some of the most important sites pertaining to Lenin and the Bolshevik Party. Departing from the pier your drive takes you to the city area where you'll pass Decembrists Square, home of the "Bronze Horseman" monument, and the University Embankment. Pass Peter and Paul Fortress en route to the Kshesinskaya Mansion. From this vantage point, you will have an excellent view of the River Neva, the Hermitage, and the gilded spire of Peter and Paul Fortress.

Kshesinskaya Mansion, now a Museum of Political History, is the former home of prima ballerina Kshesinskaya. In February 1917, it became the seat of the Council of Soldier's and Worker's Deputies. From the balcony of the mansion, Lenin gave his famous political speech in April 1917, known as a program of peaceful transition from the bourgeois democratic revolution to the socialist one. Your tour of the mansion will feature a visit to the offices of Lenin, and an exhibition on the evolution of Russia and its politics.

A photograph stop will be made at the Battleship Aurora, whose guns signaled the start of the 1917 Bolshevik Revolution. There you may have the opportunity to barter with local souvenir vendors before continuing past the Finland Station and the Tauride Palace en route to the Smolny Institute.

The Smolny Institute, originally built as a school for girls from aristocratic families, became the headquarters of the Bolshevik Revolution in October 1917 and where Lenin resided and worked following the communist takeover. Visit the Lenin Museum and tour the rooms in which Lenin lived, worked and slept prior to rejoining the coach for the return drive to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 mile over even surfaces. There are 133 steps to climb at the Smolny Institute and 57 steps at the Kshesinskaya Mansion. There will be limited time for souvenir shopping at the Aurora Battleship. Tour order may vary but all listed sites will be covered.

Begin with a short drive through the city to the Hermitage Museum. Located on the banks of the Neva River, the Winter Palace is home to the Hermitage Museum. The enormous complex comprises five buildings and displays one of the greatest art treasures. Today, the museum contains more than 3 million exhibits, which rival the Louvre and Prado in architectural, historical, and artistic magnificence. The Winter Palace itself is an incomparable work of art. This enormous edifice designed by Bartholomew Rastrelly in the Baroque style comprises of 1800 doors, 1900 windows and 114 staircases. The contoured ceilings, precious woods, chandeliers, magnificent halls, staterooms and elaborate staircases represent the utmost in opulence and beauty.



The guided tour in the Winter Palace will include numerous reception halls - the Small Throne Room, the Armorial Hall, the Grand Throne Hall and the Malachite Room, marvel the exhibits of the 15th - 16th centuries French art as well as works of Impressionists, with their bright colors of spring gardens, glittering river streams and wind breathing in the trees. Proceed to the Small Hermitage, famous for its exquisite decoration with marble colonnade, crystal chandeliers and the amazing Peacock Clock.

In the Old Hermitage, you will see a collection of Italian Renaissance including masterpieces of Leonardo da Vinci and Rafael. Your guide will lead you to the New Hermitage, where the 16th - 18th Italian art is presented. The halls with The Dutch collection are so rich that you can observe Rembrandt's artistic career from his early masterpieces to the very last revelations of the genius.

The culmination of your day will be a visit to the Golden Treasury Room. The Gold Room presents a significant collection of archeological finds - the famous Scythian and Greek gold, numerous royal gifts, and a collection of Western European jewelry made by the most prominent jewelers of the time.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces. This tour is not recommended for persons who have difficulties walking. The Hermitage has limited interior seating and no air-conditioning. There are approximately 120 steps covering 2 stories and 2 wheelchair accessible lifts in the Hermitage; however, 4 - 7 steps that must be climbed first to reach the lifts. There are two lifts in the Hermitage Museum, one of them goes to the second floor only, the other goes to the second and third floors. Large carry bags, umbrellas and heavy coats are not permitted and must be checked prior to entering the museum. Camera and video fees for the Hermitage Museum are included in the tour cost. Flash photos are usually not permitted in areas displaying paintings. There are small gift shops and stalls throughout the museum. The visit to the Gold Room is only performed by pre-arranged appointments, no exceptions.

Pass along the outskirts of the city en route to the luxurious summer palaces of the Romanovs. A short drive through the Russian countryside will take you to the Palace of Pavlovsk, one of Russia's most beautifully restored palaces. Catherine the Great presented the land of Pavlovsk to her son Paul, who then began construction of what was to become the grandest of all Russian palaces. Pavlovsk's ground covers an area of 1,500 acres, making it one of the largest landscaped parks in Europe. Visit the State Apartments, the Hall of Knights, the Hall of Peace, and the Hall of War connected with Greek Hall and others. After the tour in the palace, you will take a short walk to the Palace Restaurant, where a Russian lunch will be served. Following lunch, you will board your coach for the 30-minute transfer to Pushkin, originally known as Tzar's Village.

Catherine's Palace, designed by Rastrelli, has a stunning facade of nearly 1,000 feet long adorned with gold and white ornaments. You will be guided through the various lavishing rooms, including the Grand Throne Room, a masterpiece of the Baroque style, the State Dining Room, the Amber Room, the Blue Drawing Room, and others. After the tour in the Palace, you will take a short walk through the gardens towards the coach park where you will be able to have a look at the local souvenirs.

Reboard your coach for a short drive to Alexander's Palace, the last official royal residence. In 1906 after the royal family realized that their only son Alexis had hemophilia, they made a decision to leave St. Petersburg's Winter Palace and settle down in the former summer residence, Alexanders Palace, where they stayed during their last years until the fall of the monarchy. In the 12 halls opened after the restoration, you will see costumes and private belongings of Nicholas II and his family.

Note: Each palace requires approximately 0.5 mile of walking over even and uneven surfaces with approximately 200 steps. Special shoe covers must be worn when touring the palaces. Camera and video fees are included in the tour cost. Flash photos are usually not permitted in areas displaying paintings. Photography in Alexander's Palace is allowed and photography and video fees are included in the tour price. There is limited shopping at Tsarskoye Selo (Pushkin). Tour order may vary but all listed sites will be covered. Time permitting; you will have approximately 20 minutes for souvenir shopping in the flea market

behind Catherine's Palace.

The Yusupov family line goes back at least as far as the Romanovs. Crimean merchants of Tartar extraction, the family's wealth rivaled that of the Tsar himself, with some believing the Yusupovs to be richer. As a favorite of the Felix Yusupov, the palace was decorated lavishly exemplifying his wealth and eccentric lifestyle. Once, while in Italy, Felix admired a beautiful white marble staircase and offered to purchase it. Unfortunately, for Yusupov, the owner refused to sell. Not to be disappointed, Yusupov purchased the whole palace, dismantled the staircase and shipped it to St. Petersburg where it sits in his favorite palace today. It was in this palace that Prince Felix Yusupov, had conspired to kill a man whom he regarded a real threat to the future of the Russian Empire. Gregory Rasputin, a peasant who had gained control over the tsar's family through his alleged supernatural powers, was murdered at the Yusupov Palace and his death was as mysterious as his life. Your guide will escort you to the cellar, where 'Madame Tussauds' style wax statues reenact that tragic tea party for you. You will also descend the palace's famous Italian marble staircase to the private theater, sumptuously decorated in the rococo style.

Following the tour of the palace, you will experience a canal cruise where the boat will glide along the canals passing by the embankments with palaces and theaters, museums and private homes. The boat cruises past St. Isaac's Cathedral built in 1858. This is one of the largest churches in the world with a huge gold dome. Further along the Moika is a group of yellow buildings that form the Teachers Training University. At the time of Catherine the Great it used to house the orphanage instituted by the empress. Next is the Stroganov Palace, a baroque masterpiece of Rossi, Count Stroganov, who was the president of the Academy of Arts and a noted collector. The Stroganovs amassed their huge fortune through the monopoly they held on salt. The boat cruises under the Choir Bridge. It takes its name from the Choir Hall located nearby. A cruise along the Moika and the Neva Rivers is another chance to appreciate history and splendid architecture of this beautiful city. At the conclusion of your scenic tour, rejoin your coach for the return trip to the pier.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1 mile over flat and cobblestone surfaces with 100 steps. There are a lot of steps on the boat pier and it is not accessible to wheelchairs. Participants should take care while entering/exiting the riverboats. The top decks of the boats are not open for guests' usage due to the close proximity to the bridges. Camera fees for Yusupov Palace are included in the tour cost. Flash photo restrictions might apply in certain rooms. Videos are not permitted. Due to the stair climbing involved on this tour, it is not recommended for guests with walkers or wheelchairs. Continue with a short drive to the one of the main landmarks of St. Petersburg - the Church of Resurrection on the Spilled Blood, marvelous Russian-style multicolored, onion-domed church which was built on the spot where Emperor Alexander II was assassinated on March 1, 1881. There you will have an opportunity to shop at the neighboring flea market. Continue by driving across the Neva River to view the Spit of Vasilievsky Island, flanked by two Rostral Columns originally lighthouses. There you can enjoy the magnificent view of the Neva River in its widest part. In front of you is the Peter and Paul Fortress, the first structure of the city.

This tour will give you an opportunity to visit the Peter and Paul Fortress territory - one of the highlights of the city with the St Peter's and St. Paul's Cathedral, museums and a number of interesting buildings that complete the ensemble of the Fortress. Following your walk at the Fortress territory, you will visit one of the souvenir shops with abundance of traditional Russian souvenirs.

Note: This tour is recommended for guests with walking difficulties; however, guests must be able to walk approximately 300



yards over even and gravel surfaces with 5 steps at the souvenir shop. Tour itinerary may change but all mentioned sites will be covered. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 30 minutes for shopping and browsing at the souvenir shop.

WS45 - Panoramic Stockholm & Vasa Museum

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



The tour begins with a drive up to Fjallgatan for a panoramic view of the city, then continues cross Gamla Stan, the enchanting medieval Old Town past the Royal Palace overlooking Stockholm's inner harbor. Proceed along Strandvagen to the island of Djurgarden, regarded as Stockholm's amusement and recreation.

Visit the Vasa, once considered to be one of the world's largest and most prestigious warships. The museum is built around the 17th century warship, which sank in Stockholm's inner harbor on her maiden voyage in 1628. Salvaged in 1961 and today restored to much of its former glory, the Vasa represents an authentic piece of living history.

Continue through the Diplomat areas and through Ostermalm, a fashionable neighborhood of stately apartment buildings to the modern shopping and business areas at Hamngatan and Sergels Torg before returning to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.25 mile over even surfaces with 5 - 10 steps. There is an elevator available in the Vasa Ship Museum. The order of the tour may vary but all mentioned sights would be covered. This is a panoramic tour with photo stops along the way, and an interior visit to the Vasa Museum.

WS46 - Stockholm Beauty on Land & Water

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



A panoramic tour of Stockholm showing most of the city's main sights and beautiful scenery. A perfect combination of coach and boat.

Pass the enchanting medieval Old Town, "Gamla Stan" with the Royal Palace overlooking Stockholm's inner harbour. View of the impressive City Hall, the site of the annual Nobel Prize Banquet, pass the Royal Opera House and drive through the modern shopping and business areas at Hamngatan and Sergels Torg before leaving your coach to board your motor-launch for an approximately 50 min. "Royal Canal" tour taking you into the Eco Park, Stockholm's National City Park.

Cruise along Strandvagen, one of the most exclusive areas in Stockholm and on through the green and lush park areas of Djurgarden. Pass the Grona Lund Tivoli, the Skansen Open Air Museum and the well known Vasa Museum, housing the 17th century warship Vasa, just to mention a few of the sights.

WS47 - Royal Palace & The Old Town

Get to know the oldest and most charming part of Stockholm, the Old Town. Witness the historic elegance of the exterior of the Royal Palace, nowadays the Stockholm Palace is the King's work place while Drottningholm Palace is the permanent home of the Royal Family. Visit the State Apartments displaying magnificent baroque and rococo interiors, and still often being used for different functions.

Continue with your guide for a walk along the narrow streets and experience the medieval intimacy of what is today a living historical monument of international renown. See the exterior of the Cathedral, the oldest church in Stockholm, see Stortorget, the Great Square, being the centre of the Old Town, dominated by the old Stock Exchange, today housing the Nobel (Prize) Museum and the Swedish Academy, whose members every year decide the laureate of the Nobel Prize for Literature.

Enjoy some free time for independent activities before returning to the ship..

Note: The tour of Old Town is by foot on cobblestone streets with approximately 1 mile of walking. The Royal Palace involves approximately 400 yards of walking with approximately 150 steps. The order of the tour may vary but all mentioned sights will be covered. In the event that the Royal Palace is closed due to a private function, a venue substitution will be made and will be announced on board the ship. Should the State Apartments be closed during your visit, either the Bernadotte or Guest Apartments will be substituted. Photography is not permitted inside the Royal Palace. Camera and video cameras are not permitted in the Royal Armoury. Time permitting, guests will have approximately 45 minutes of free time for browsing and shopping in Old Town.

WS48 - Historic Stockholm & Sigtuna

DURATION: 7 Hours Approx.



From the pier, commence with a drive to the island of Gamla Stan, the Old Town. Witness the historic elegance of the dominating Royal Palace when leaving the coach for a short guided walk. Stroll along the cobblestone streets of the oldest and coziest quarters in Stockholm. Thereafter you will visit the number one attraction in Stockholm, the Vasa Museum located on the island of Djurgarden. The warship Vasa capsized and sank on her maiden voyage in 1628.

Continue through the outskirts of the city en route to Sigtuna, approximately 45 minutes drive north of Stockholm and beautifully set on the Lake Mamlaren. A town with great charm, picturesque wooden houses, narrow alleys and the smallest Town Hall in Scandinavia, dating from 1744. Tour the major points of interest including one of the Church Ruins, the Town Hall, St Mary's church and "Stora Gatan", the oldest street in Sweden.

Enjoy some free time before returning to Stockholm and the pier.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 400 yards through the Vasa Ship Museum and approximately 1.5 miles over cobblestone streets through the Old Town and Sigtuna with 15 to 20 steps. There is an elevator in the Vasa Ship Museum. The tour order may vary but all mentioned sights would be covered. Lunch is not included in this tour; however, there is time for lunch and shopping on your own.

WS49 - Drottningholm Palace, Residence of the Swedish

Drottningholm with the Royal Palace, the Court Theatre, the Chinese Pavilion, and the beautiful French and English gardens, was the first Swedish site to be placed on the UNESCO World Heritage list. It was appointed as the best preserved example of an 18th century palatial setting in Sweden and is also representative of all European Royal architecture using Versailles as a model. Located on the island of Lovon in the lake Mallaren, the Palace has been the residence of the Swedish Royal Family since 1981.

Visit the magnificently decorated State Apartments, followed by a visit to the Drottningholm Court Theatre, one of the world's most famous theatrical establishments. Fully restored, this 18th century theatre is unique in that its original sets, stage



machinery and props are in perfect working order and still in use.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.6 mile over even surfaces and numerous amount of steps. The order of the tour may vary but all mentioned sights will be covered.

WS51 - Stockholm & its Famous Archipelago

Drive through the beautiful Swedish countryside, to the town of Vaxholm, often referred to as the Pearl of the Archipelago. The imposing Vaxholm Fortress will be seen across the water. Enjoy a guided tour of the bustling town before continuing across to the island of Rindo, also an old fortification, but today a summer paradise for many Stockholmers. Further across to Vando, which reaches the most distant islands in the Baltic Sea. Its population of about 30,000 inhabitants grows four times its size in the summer due to the fact that so many choose to spend their vacation here.

Lunch will be served at the charming Siggesta Gard, and following lunch continue to Gustavsberg, a historic town, famous throughout the world for its china factory, founded in 1825. The main attraction is the Porcelain Museum a real treasure trove with all kinds of porcelain ranging from Granny's coffee cups to functional household ceramics.

After the visit, there will be time on your own before returning to Stockholm for a panoramic tour. Take a walk in the harbour with its many leisure boats or do some bargain shopping in one of the shops.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1 mile over uneven and cobblestone surfaces with steps. The order of the tour may vary but all mentioned sights would be covered.

WS55 - Cocktail Cruise around Royal Djurgarden

Stockholm, strategically built where the freshwater lake Malaren meets the Baltic Sea, shows herself from the most beautiful side when seen from the water. Often referred to as "the Beauty on Water", Stockholm is built upon 14 different islands and the mainland, all linked together by over 50 bridges.

Water plays an important role in every day life and boating, swimming and fishing are popular activities in this capital city where over a third of the total surface area is water, an additional third, parks and green areas.

While cruising the glittering waters of the Baltic Sea enjoy a glass of sparkling wine and some dry snacks while enjoying the scenery. Cruise along Strandvagen, the most exclusive street in Stockholm, pass the impressive Vasa Museum and continue further into the Eco Park area and through the bay and narrow canal of Djurgardsbrunn.

Through its unique mixture of nature and culture, the Stockholm National City Park was founded in 1995. Here you can find rare species of plants and insects not found elsewhere in Sweden along with hundreds of protected and architecturally unique buildings among them the Rosendal Palace, the Thiel Gallery and Waldemarsudde.

Cruise through the green and lush park areas of Djurgarden before getting out on more open waters towards Fjaderholmarna, the Feather Islands, being the first real archipelago islands. Today a popular recreation area yet at the same time important for its lively and unique bird colonies. Cruise around the islands before turning around, returning to the city and your ship.

WS58 - Ice Bar and Old Town

Leave the pier en route to Stockholm's oldest and cosiest quarters, the Old Town (Gamla Stan). Witness the historic elegance



of the exterior of the dominating Royal Palace combined with a walk along the narrow, twisting alleys and cobblestone streets. You will experience the medieval intimacy of what is today a living historical monument of international renown. As you walk with your guide, you can savour the Bohemian atmosphere and the sense of age in houses dating from the 16th to the 19th centuries with Baroque doorways and rusting coats of arms. You will also see Stortorget (Great Square) - the hub of the Old Town, dominated by the old Stock Exchange, today, housing the Nobel Museum and the Swedish Academy, which meets each year to decide the laureate of the Nobel Prize for Literature.

Rejoin your coach and continue through Stockholm's city centre to the Nordic Hotel right in the heart of the city where the world's first permanent ice bar is located. The interior is kept at below zero temperature - 5 degreeC all year round. All the interior including glasses are made of pure, clear ice from the Torne River in Northern Sweden. All guests are provided with warm fur ponchos, mittens and shoes before entering. A vodka drink in an ice glass will be served and the staff will tell you more about the bar and its construction.

Note: Guests must be at least 18 years of age to participate in the vodka tasting. Please bring photo identification with you. Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.7 kilometre over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, inclines and 3 - 4 steps to enter/exit the coach. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Depending on traffic and the crowding at the venues, the guide may reverse the tour route but covering all listed sights.

Tallinn, Estonia

The tour order and exact route/itinerary may vary depending upon where the vessel will dock and local conditions.

Exterior walking portions of the listed tours will be conducted in all weather conditions (rain or shine). Guests are advised to take the appropriate weather gear and wear comfortable walking shoes. The best quality transportation has been obtained for the excursion program; however, all vehicles' air-conditioning systems may not be to North American standards.

TL45 - Tallinn's Old Town & Estonian Parliament House

PRICE: ADULT: 44.00 / CHILD: 28.00 USD

DURATION: 3 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



Become acquainted with the sights of Tallinn's Old Town, one of the finest medieval towns in northern Europe. Drive to Upper Town, passing ancient walls and tower gateways and disembark the coach at Tall Hermann Tower from which flies the national blue, black and white flag. Walk up Toompea Hill to Palace Square, where the house of the Estonian parliament, the Riigikogu, is situated. Sessions of the Riigikogu have taken place in Toompea Castle since 1922, but the history of the castle runs much longer - it portrays the story of rulers and power in Estonia as far back as the 13th century. You will have the unique opportunity to visit the interior of the castle, passing through its long corridors, the White Hall and the most outstanding room of the building, the parliamentary chamber, with ultramarine walls and a lemon-yellow ceiling, which extends through three floors.

Afterwards you will view the lovely Russian Orthodox Alexander Nevski Cathedral, a dominating feature of Upper Town's city skyline and home to numerous golden icons and mosaics. From here continue along Tallinn's medieval cobbled streets to view the gothic Dome Church, also known as St. Mary's Cathedral. Descend Short Leg Street to the Lower Town and visit St. Nicholas Church, dating back to the 14th century, which is at present used as an art museum. On display there are old altars, as well as a famous painting by Bernt Notke, the "Danse Macabre" - one of the most unique examples of medieval art. Stop in Town Hall Square where free time is given to view the Gothic Town Hall, to shop for handicrafts or enjoy refreshments at one of the Square's cafes. Walk to the coach park to drive back to the port.

Note: Guest must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces with approximately 70+ steps. Comfortable walking shoes and hat are recommended. ID, preferable passport, is required to enter the Estonian Parliament House. Guests may stay in town at the end of the tour and make their own way back to the ship. Tour order may vary but all mentioned sites will be covered.

This tour is not available on Sunday, June 8th, as the Estonian Parliament House is closed on Sundays.

TL46 - Medieval Streets of Tallinn & Kadriorg Palace

DURATION: 6 Hours Approx.



Become acquainted with the sights of Tallinn's Old Town, one of the finest medieval towns in northern Europe. Drive to Upper Town, passing ancient walls and tower gateways and disembark the coach at Tall Hermann Tower from which flies the national blue, black and white flag. Walk up Toompea Hill to Palace Square. View the baroque Toompea Castle, now the residence of the Estonian Parliament and visit the lovely Russian Orthodox Alexander Nevski Cathedral, a dominating feature of Upper Town's city skyline, and home to numerous golden icons and mosaics. From here continue along Tallinn's medieval cobbled streets to visit the gothic Dome Church, also known as St Mary's Cathedral. Proceed to the scenic viewpoint over the Lower Town rooftops, where there will be a short opportunity for shopping at the small shops. Descend Short Leg Street to the Lower Town. Stop in Town Hall Square where free time is given to shop.

You will have an opportunity to visit Tallinn's late Gothic Town Hall building, which is one of the most famed symbols of the city, recognized throughout Estonia as a venerable, unique architectural treasure. The Town Hall was established on the

central square probably at the beginning of 13th century. In 1402-1404, the building was substantially reconstructed. The exterior we know today dates from this period, and the basic room plan has also been preserved, as it was reconstructed for hosting receptions. The European Union Prize for Cultural Heritage, the Europa Nostra medal, was presented to Tallinn Town Hall in a ceremony on 15 September 2006 by Siim Kallas, Vice President of the European Commission, and Thomas Willoch, Europa Nostra board member.

Rejoin the coaches to drive to Kadriorg Palace, founded by Peter the Great in honor of his empress wife Catherine I. Its magnificent scale is enhanced by its setting in tiered gardens in contrasting styles. The Swan Pond, with its picturesque island and the grottoes in the upper garden, is a visual delight. Kadriorg means "Catherine's Valley" in Estonian, though the palace was seldom visited by the Czarina. Since the Russian Revolution the ornate palace rooms have been used as an art museum and, following closure in recent years, Kadriorg has reopened in its former glory. Walk back to coaches and drive back to the port.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.2 miles over uneven, gravel and cobblestone surfaces, inclines and 25 - 40 steps. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Visitation to the interior of the Dome Church is not possible on Sundays due to regularly scheduled church services and functions.

TL47 - Cafe Culture of Old Tallinn

DURATION: 4 Hours 15 Minutes Approx.



Visitors to Tallinn in Soviet times say they remember from Tallinn the chiming of church bells on Sunday morning as well as the aroma of coffee over the streets of the Old Town. Tallinn is still proud of its cafes. There are cafes in the ancient medieval defense towers, in the former houses of merchants as well as in modern buildings. Coffee has been known in Europe since the 17-th century, and Estonians have drunk coffee since this time. During this tour we would like you to become acquainted with the history of Tallinn as well as enjoying short stops in different Old Town cafes.

Begin your walking tour in the Upper Town where the first cafe to visit is Cafe Bogapott with its ceramics studio, situated within the ancient town walls. This unique cafe where all tableware is made by Georg Bogatkin, the owner of the cafe. You will have an opportunity to taste traditional kvass, a rye bread flavoured drink, and a Baltic sprat snack. There is also a small souvenir shop. Next descend to the Lower Town, the famous area of merchants. Here you will enjoy a local pastry and a cup of coffee in Cafe Matilda, located in the building where the famous European painter Michael Sittow lived in the 16th Century.

Then on to visit Cafe Maiasmokk where the interior dating from the 19-th century has been preserved. One of the specialties of Estonia, marzipan, is produced here and an exhibition on the history of marzipan reveals how a medicament initially made in the pharmacy became a sweet. There will be an opportunity for tasting. After visiting Cafe Maiasmokk, continue to Town Hall square which becomes a big open air cafe in the summer. Here you can enjoy a short period of free time. The final stop on this tour will be at De La Gardie department store, where from Allen's cafe on the roof terrace you can enjoy wonderful views over the rooftops of Old Tallinn.

Note: Guest must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces with approximately 30+ steps. Comfortable walking shoes and hat are recommended. Guests may stay in town at the end of the tour and make their own way back to the ship. Tour order may vary but all mentioned sites will be covered.

TL49 - Tallinn - City of Contrasts

PRICE: ADULT: 48.00 / CHILD: 28.00 USD

DURATION: 3 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



This tour reveals the many contrasting faces of Tallinn, its differing nature and styles of life. First drive through the modern and bustling city centre with its banks, shops and offices, and even there see the preserved wooden churches and houses from the beginning of the 20th century. While driving to the apartment district of Lasnamae you will notice examples of limestone, the principal stone to be found in Estonia. Limestone has been used here as a building material for a thousand years. In the 1970's, during the soviet period, Lasnamae was constructed as a vast residential district. You will see the

plainness of the apartment houses in their never-ending rows.

Driving from Lasnamae to the Kose-Pirita district you will witness a very different type of architecture private houses from 1950-60's, all in their neat gardens. In Pirita you can also see the racecourse which has always been popular, even in soviet times. Just across the Pirita River lie the majestic ruins of St. Bridget's Convent. The largest convent in Old Livonia, St. Bridget's was founded in 1407 as part of a Swedish religious order and functioned until its destruction by Ivan the Terrible's forces in 1577. What remains are massive, gothic facade and walls of the main building, foundations, cellars, and a cemetery. The coast of the nearby Viimsi peninsula saw the arrival of its first inhabitants over the two centuries, 1271-1471. Habitation developed along the coastline, and immigrants from Sweden played an important role. Gradually mixed settlements appeared, where side-by-side with the Swedes lived Estonians and Finns. In the 19th century the lands of Viimsi manor stretched as far as the western shore of the peninsula from the mouth of Pirita River to Rohuneeme village. During the soviet period Viimsi was the centre of a prominent collective fish farm. Even today you can see the old farm buildings alongside new houses which are building up rapidly. The Open Air Museum displays Estonian peasant architecture from the 19-20th centuries: it was founded in 1980 within the former Kingu farmstead buildings. Here you will enjoy refreshments in a restaurant overlooking the picturesque seashore.

Note: Guest must be able to walk approximately 650 yards over even and grassy surfaces, inclines and 5 - 15 steps. Comfortable non-slip shoes are recommended. Guests may stay in town at the end of the tour or make their own way back to the ship. Tour order may vary but all mentioned sites will be covered.

TL59 - Tallinn Walking Tour

PRICE: ADULT: 46.00 / CHILD: 26.00 USD

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.



Dominated by the influence of the old Hanseatic League, the well-preserved medieval quarter of Tallinn, with its narrow cobblestone alleyways, is best enjoyed on foot.

Pass from the port to the Upper Town of Tallinn, where you will disembark the coach at Tall Hermann Tower to begin your walking tour. Stop in the Upper Town near Palace Square to visit the Russian Orthodox Church of St. Alexander Nevski. Built in the traditional style of Moscow churches of the 17th century, the interior contains a number of interesting icons and mosaics. A visit will also be made to the famous 13th-century Dome Church (except for Sunday port visits). Afterwards, walk a short distance for a beautiful panoramic view of the Lower Town with its towers and steeples rising above cluster of red-tiled roofs.

Continue to Lower Town through the 15th-century Short Leg Gate, where you'll pass St. Nicholas Church, one of Tallinn's oldest monuments. On Long Street, pass the Brotherhood of Blackheads, a former merchant organization whose house is noted for its renovated 16th-century Renaissance facade. Nearby, see the Holy Ghost Church of 1316. In the Lower Town, you will have a short stop in Town Hall Square, the center of Tallinn's network of old streets, to see the Town Hall. Completed in 1404, and preserved almost fully intact in its original Gothic form, this structure still serves as the City Hall. Your walking tour will end near the Viru Gate, where you will have the option to stay in town or return to the ship via coach.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over uneven surfaces and cobblestone streets, several inclines with approximately 90 steps. Visitation to the interior of the Dome Church is not possible on Sundays due to regularly scheduled church services and functions. There are limited opportunities to shop at the Viewpoint. Guests may stay in town at the end of the tour. Tour order may vary but all mentioned sites will be covered.

TL60 - Panoramic Tallinn

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



This tour is designed for those guests who would enjoy seeing Tallinn from the comforts of a coach. Pass through Kadriorg Park en route from the port to the city of Tallinn. A highlight of the park is the Song Festival Grounds, with an amphitheater specially built for the popular Estonian Song Festival. You will pass by the Forest Cemetery where distinguished Estonians are buried amongst the pine trees before continuing on to Pirita, the beachside location of the yachting complex built for the 1980



Olympic Games. From this vantage point, the 16th century ruins of St. Bridget's Convent can be seen.

A short drive follows where ancient walls and tower gates come into view. Arriving at the Great Coast Gate of Tallinn, observe the magnificent "Stout Margaret" Cannon Tower. Stop for photographs at the Tall Hermann Tower, from where you will have the option to walk the short distance up Toompea Hill to Palace Square, to view from the outside the baroque Toompea Castle, now housing the Estonian Parliament. You may also visit the Alexander Nevski Cathedral, which dominates the city skyline. Departing from Tall Hermann Tower, continue past the original city walls built in 1229. Then proceed past St. Kaarli's Church, the Estonian Opera and the Hotel Viru, Tallinn's premier hotel located just outside the Old Town enroute to the port.

Note: You will have the option of staying in town or returning to the ship at the conclusion of your tour. There are approximately 50 yards of walking over even surfaces with 15 steps. The walking portion at Tall Hermann Tower is optional and at your discretion. Tour order may vary but all mentioned sites will be covered.

TL61 - Best of Tallinn with Concert and Lunch

This full-day tour starts with a visit to the Song Festival Ground where a short stop will provide you with an impression of the Song Festivals that are held on the grounds every five years. A short drive follows to Tallinn's Upper Town, passing ancient walls, tower gateways, and disembark the coach at Tall Hermann Tower. Walk up Toompea Hill to Palace Square to view the baroque Toompea Castle, now the residence of the Estonian Parliament, and to visit the Russian Orthodox Alexander Nevski Cathedral. Walk along Tallinn's medieval cobblestone streets to visit the gothic Dome Church, known as St. Mary's Cathedral. Proceed to the scenic viewpoint over the Lower Town rooftops, where there will be limited time for shopping in the small shops. Descend Short Leg Street to the Lower Town for an independent visit to the Town Hall Square and view the exterior of the gothic Town Hall. In this square at one of Tallinn's typical Old Town restaurants, lunch will be served. A special visit to the historic Dominican Monastery is accompanied by a concert of medieval music in the courtyard. Continue your walk along Catherine's Passage where shopping and browsing opportunities at the local craft workshops (including glass, leather, millinery and ceramic wares) await you. Return to the coach for the return drive to the vessel.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over uneven surfaces and cobblestone streets, several inclines with approximately 90 steps. Visitation to the interior of the Dome Church is not possible on Sundays due to regularly scheduled church services and functions. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 30 minutes for shopping and browsing. Guests may stay in town at the end of the tour or make their own way back to the ship. Tour order may vary but all mentioned sites will be covered.
